Mrs. Harinec first touched my life as I heard prayer for her during our Lord's Day worship services in late 2001/2002. I had met her son George, an elder at our church...always faithful in attendance and his assistance to me on a very slippery winter Sunday morning as I was trying to walk to my car made an impression then and still, to this day I haven't forgotten that overture of kindness.
