Mr. Dimsey was born in Vienna, VA to the late Guy and Pearl (Cockrill) Dimsey. He was a “blue” baby. After the delivering doctor told his parents he would be dead within 2 hours and left, his life was saved by a neighbor who was a veterinarian who utilized an instrument used on animals to clear the blockage down his throat. He was predeceased by his wife of 60 years Ruby (Downs) Dimsey, and one son Larry Otis Dimsey. He was the oldest and last Dimsey children living. He resided in Vienna, VA from 1920-1999.

**Bruce Dimsey** posted:

As a part of the "great generation" who lived through the "great depression years" and World War II, Dad's priority was always to provide for life to be better for his children and grandchildren. In 1947 at age 27 and newly wed, him and mom with \$5,000 each they had saved built the house they would live in until 1999 in Vienna, Virginia. They never had a house payment all their days! He loved to walk the parks and the family enjoyed vacations yearly throughout the nation including the Grand Canyon, Yosemite, Yellow Stone and the Grand Tetons. In all his 97 years he ate whatever he wanted and never took a pill for cholesterol. At age 96 when confronted with the simple gospel primarily from John 3 and Romans 3, he "saw the light", a sinner in need of a savior, he repented and believed on the Lord Jesus Christ as his savior. John 3:18 - Jesus is God's provision for salvation and not to be rejected. In December 2016 he had two hospital stay's related primarily to diastolic congestive heart failure. The heart muscle becomes "leather like" and does not retain the proper flex to operate properly. Upon release from the hospital he was put under hospice care with Capital Caring in his own home until October of this year when he was transported to the Adler Center in Aldie, Va. Capital Caring (hospice) both in home and the Adler Center are simply excellent! Every member of the care teams they provided were simply professional and caring individuals. You could not ask for more. When you need them, they will be there. I commend them and recommend them!
