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Calvin James McGehee Jr of Ashburn, VA, passed away on Saturday, December 22, 2018, at the age of 82.

Calvin was born to parents, Calvin James Sr and Margaret McGehee on August 3, 1936, in New Orleans, Louisiana. Growing up he was active in the Boy Scouts and received the Eagle Scout merit badge. He attended Myers Park High School in Charlotte, NC, where he graduated in 1955. Calvin enrolled in the United States Army Corps in 1959 and served for 6 years, both in active duty and the Army reserves. While serving, he studied Russian at the U.S. Army Language School, after which he was stationed in Japan at the 12th US Army Security Agency. He attended Davidson College receiving his diploma in Business-Economics, graduating in 1963. He was a member of the Sigma Nu Fraternity. After college, Calvin began his work career as a credit and financial manager with Uniroyal, Inc. in Charlotte, NC. He then worked for more than 25 years for General Telephone of the South as a District and Division Manager for different regions and departments, and was responsible for training programs within the company. After retirement, he went on to receive his North Carolina Real Estate License. Later, he was recruited by Volt Telecommunications as a consultant. Calvin was actively involved in his community, serving on the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce, Charles Town Kiwanis Club, and West Virginia Telephone Association. As a member of the Charles Town Presbyterian Church, he was part of both the Board of Deacons and Elders. Calvin and his wife Judy relocated to Virginia to be close to and enjoy time with their daughters and grandchildren. He was a beloved husband, father and grandfather.

He is survived by his wife, Judy, daughters Suzanne and Julie, son-in-law, Frederick, and grandchildren, Mireille, Cullen, and Quinn. He is preceded in death by his parents, Calvin James Sr, Margaret Sue Logan McGehee and sister, Peggy.

I met him during a Covenant Presbyterian youth retreat in Montreat, NC. It was kind of a meet and greet for youth groups of the combining churches of Westminster (Dilworth Rd.) and Second (downtown) Presbyterian. We stayed at the Assembly Inn there in Montreat, and had much fun running up and down on the elevators as I remember. Calvin and I attended youth activities and conferences sponsored by Covenant Church. We both were in the Boy Scouts during that same period. I remember when he received the rank of Eagle, the highest award in scouting. We also spent time at old Camp Steere on Lake Wiley. He taught me how to water-ski behind his 14 ft. runabout. I used to frequently visit his home over on Lombardy Circle. I was there around the time he received his acceptance letter from Davidson College. Strangely, he seemed upset. I asked why. He explained that the letter implied that he was being accepted because of his father, and not necessarily because of his academics. I moved away from Charlotte in 1964, and didn't see Calvin until several years later, after his military service and graduation from Davidson. He was employed at the time by Uniroyal.
