Upon his retirement from the military, he continued working as a systems' analyst and software engineer both in the private sector and as a contractor for the U.S. military. Most recently, Brad owned and operated his own business, Objective Services. Through-out this time he proudly acted as Business Consultant for Supag, an International Company based in Switzerland.

He was an inspiration and a hero to his family, friends, and the many people he met along the way. His greatest love was his wife, Nita, and his family. He was a great lover of life and of people. He loved to laugh and, more importantly, make others laugh. He enjoyed traveling, visiting with friends and relatives, spending time on the computer, and memorializing his life experiences through pictures and writings. After receiving a diagnosis of terminal cancer in November of 2009, he made the brave choice to live with

cancer, rather than die from it, continuing to live his life to the fullest and sharing that journey with everyone around him. He was very grateful for the life that he had and felt that his life was very blessed. He left a legacy of his teachings through his knowledge and example.
