



## Mitchell Yale Davis

December 1, 1962 - December 22, 2020

He was a mentor, friend, teacher, and consummate student of life. Oh, and let us not

forget he was also a gentlemen farmer, body builder, Black Belt in Shidōkan Karate, State Champion Traditional Archer, avid prepper, notorious for his disdain for government, hated the IRS and the Police. Some things we cannot discuss as they may be watching... but those who know, know!
